Summer Crime Prevention Reminder: from your Designing Out Crime Officer (DOCO)

As we move into Summer and spend more time outdoors, Surrey Heath residents are encouraged to remain mindful of seasonal crime risks. Longer daylight hours and increased outdoor activity can create opportunities for opportunistic offenders.

Neighbourhood Watch members play a vital role in helping keep our communities safe. A few simple steps can make a big difference.

Keep your home secure

- Always lock doors and windows, even when you're at home or in the garden
- Don't leave windows open in empty rooms
- Ensure garages, sheds, and side gates are kept locked

Protect bikes, tools and garden items

- Secure bikes with quality locks to fixed objects
- Lock away tools and equipment after use
- Consider property marking or registering valuables

Maintain good visibility

- Keep hedges trimmed, especially at the front of your property

- Ensure entrances are visible from the street and neighbouring homes
- Remove or reduce potential hiding places near doors and windows

Check your lighting

- Use sensor or dusk-to-dawn lighting where possible
- Make sure all external lights are working and cover key access points

Vehicle security

- Lock your vehicle and remove valuables every time
- Consider additional security such as steering locks
- Park in well-lit, overlooked areas where possible

Stay alert and report

If you see anything suspicious, please report it

- 101 for non-emergencies
- 999 in an emergency

Strong community awareness is one of the best deterrents to crime
